

80	and Outreach Director of the program, presented an overview of the Health Professions		

Education Foundation (HPEF), a statewide program that is considered a public benefit 81 corporation. Its purpose is to help medically underserved areas by providing culturally 82 and linguistically competent individuals to deliver medical services. These individuals 83 receive scholarships and loan repayments as an incentive to work in these locations. 84 The Mental Health Loan Assumption Program (MHLAP), funded through the Mental 85 Health Services Act, allows applicants up to \$10,000 in exchange for a one year of 86 service obligation in the Public Mental Health System. The purpose of this program is to 87 88 encourage mental health professionals to practice in areas with underserved medical needs by approving a plan for a repayment to their educational loans, and to help 89 counties in the Public Mental Health System hire and retain these professionals. The 90 Licensed Mental Health Services Provider Education Program (LMH), funded through 91 the Board of Psychology and Board of Behavioral Sciences renewal fees and a one-92 time grant from the California Endowment, is designed to encourage mental health 93 professionals to practice in areas with a shortage of mental health services or at a 94 qualifying facility in California. Grants can be up to \$15,000. 95

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Mr. Burke reported that staff's recommendation is to "watch" the bill. It is a response to 288 proposed regulations by the Division of Worker's Compensation. This bill would 289 maintain the current practice of neuropsychology being recognized by Qualified Medical 290 291 Evaluators (QME). If the regulations go through without the statutory change, an injured worker may have to wait because he or she would need a referral to a 292 neuropsychologist or a new panel would need to be created; thus, delaying the 293 294 evaluation. 295 Dr. Linder-Crow reported that this is a CPA-supported bill. She said that the agency 296 wants to place neuropsychologists and psychologists into one category, which could be 297 problematic for consumer protection during the evaluation process. No action requested. 425 426 iii) AB 2198 (Levine) Suicide Prevention Update 427 428 Mr. Burke reported that the Board took an "oppose" position in August 2014 and that the 429 Governor has vetoed it. Dr. Harlem said that the Board took this position because it felt 430 that the bill was just duplicating the training that psychologists already have and that it 431 was not going to contribute to prevention issues. He suggested that the Board formulate 432 other important questions and to seek answers to those inquiries. Dr. Harlem said that 433 there was a plan created by two agencies as a result of a suicide prevention law that 434 was vetoed by Governor Schwarzenegger in 2006 and recommended that the Board 435 review this plan. He said that Ms. Sorrick has reached out to the Office of Suicide 436 437 Prevention in order to set up a meeting. 438 Gordon Doughty, a board member of the San Francisco Chapter of the American 439 Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP), provided a 2014 study from the National 440 Action Alliance on suicide prevention that provides suicide prevention clinical workforce 441 guidelines for training that was produced by its clinical workforce preparedness task 442 force. He said AFSP is also attending the Means Matters National Conference in March 443 2016 to discuss safe ways to store firearms. The Foundation has also partnered with 444 the Department of Education on a five-year program where they are paying to 445 implement youth mental health first aid throughout school districts in California. It also 446 has a school district suicide prevention plan that it is trying to implement throughout 447 school districts in California. 448 449 Mr. Victor Oiakian said that he and his wife have visited California colleges and the 450 three public universities to encourage action around student mental health and suicide 451
- 452 prevention. He reported that all three of the universities have set up committees to

453 454	address this requested action. He said that Santa Clara County is one of the first two counties to implement a suicide prevention strategic plan.
