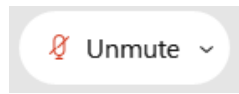


You may also join the meeting by calling in using the phone number, access code, and passcode provided in the meeting notice or on the agenda.

Red microphone = Muted: No one in the meeting can hear you.

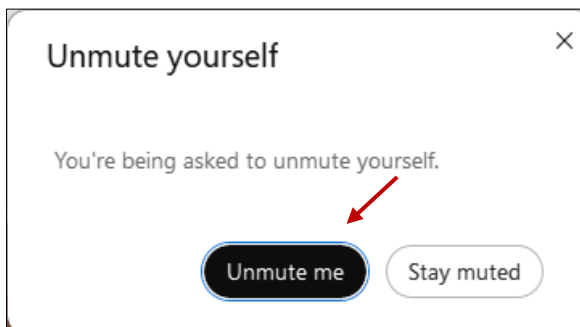

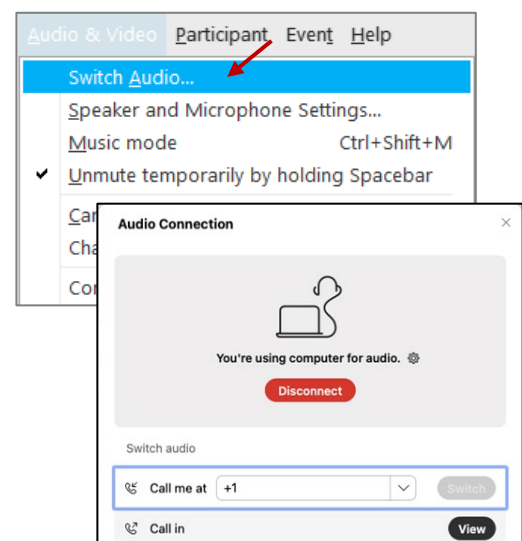
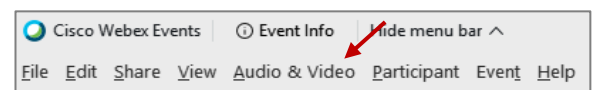
- 2 From the drop-down menu, select different:

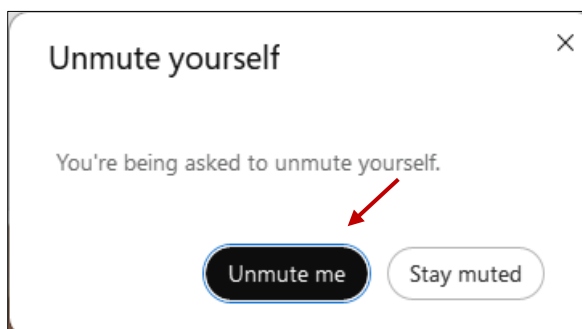

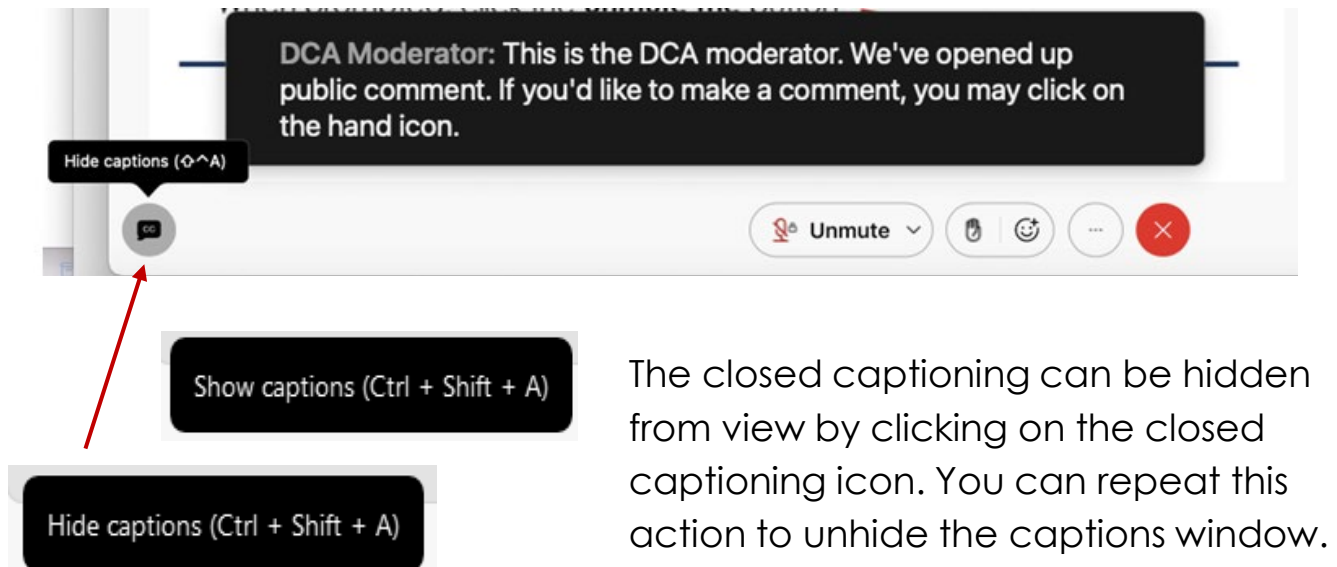
