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CALIFORNIA BOARD OF PSYCHOLOGY SUPERVISION AGREEMENT FOR SUPERVISED PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE (PURSUANT TO SECTION 1387 OF TITLE 16, CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS (CCR))

(All CCR or California Code of Regulations section refer to Title 16)

The purpose of an agreement is to ensure that both the supervisor and supervisee understand and have a plan to comply with the laws and regulations related to the accrual of supervised professional experience (SPE). Please review CCR sections 1387 et seq. prior to developing your plan for SPE. This agreement is to be reviewed, completed, and signed by both the primary supervisor and supervisee prior to the commencement of the supervised professional experience. Experience prior to preparation of a plan may not count toward qualifying the supervisee for licensure. The primary supervisor agrees to maintain this agreement until the trainee completes the SPE and requests the primary supervisor to rate and verify the experience. The primary supervisor is responsible for submitting this agreement directly to the Board along with the Verification of Experience upon completion of the experience outlined in this document.

In any supervised professional experience, the primary supervisor assumes professional and ethical responsibility for the psychological functions performed by the trainee. The supervisor is also responsible for ensuring that the supervised professional experience meets all requirements set forth in CCR section 1387 and, in the case of registered psychological assistants, in CCR section 1391.

Supervised professional experience under Section 1387 states: SPE is defined as on organized program that consists of a planned, structured and administrative sequence of professional supervised comprehensive training experiences.

Supervision Agreement

Below is a link to the Board's Supervision Agreement and Verification of Experience Form. Please refer to Title 16 of the Code, Division 13.1, Article 3, Section 1387 for the description of the requirements of Supervised Professional Experience (http://www.psychboard.ca.gov/lawsregs/2009lawsregs.pdf).

The concept of the Supervision Agreement will help facilitate communication between supervisors and supervisees making for a well thought out course of training and thereby a higher quality of supervised professional experience.

Effective January 1, 2005, an agreement must be completed and signed by the supervisor and trainee prior to accruing supervised professional experience. If the commencement of supervised professional experience occurred prior to January 1, 2005, the completion of the Supervision Agreement is still required for any hours that were accrued after January 1, 2005.

The Supervision Agreement form asks the following questions:

1. Describe the specific duties the supervisee will perform as they engage in psychological activities that directly serve to prepare the supervisee for the independent practice of psychology once licensed.

What are the specific duties to be preformed?

a. Describe an organized program that consists of a planned, structured and administered sequence of professionally supervised comprehensive clinical training experiences. SPE shall have a logical training sequence that builds upon the skills and competencies of the trainee to prepare him or her for the independent practice of psychology once he or she becomes licensed.

The goal of this question is to provide the Board with information about the sequence of training for the supervisee.

- Does this training experience provide the supervisee with a planned program of training and clinical experiences that will lead to enhanced competence and eventually independent practice?
- What are the elements of the supervised professional experience?
- What is the sequence of experience that will help the supervisee become minimally competent to practice psychology?
- How many hours of supervision and training will the supervisee receive weekly?
- How will monitoring of the supervisee's performance occur?

2. Summarize the goals and objectives of this plan for SPE, including how socialization into the profession will be achieved.

The Board seeks to understand the broad and specific goals for the supervised professional experience. The Supervisor and Supervisee should list the agreed upon goals for the supervised professional experience. For example, what are the competencies the supervisee will gain during the supervised professional experience?

Describe how the plan includes socialization into the profession of psychology and how this socialization will be augmented by integrated modalities including mentoring, didactic exposure, role modeling, enactment, observational/vicarious learning, supervision and consultative guidance.

The goal of this item is to provide the Board with information about how the supervisor will integrate current knowledge with supervised training experiences.

- How will current and evolving psychological knowledge and theories be integrated into the supervisee's practice of psychology?
- What will occur during the supervision sessions?
- How will the supervision sessions help prepare the supervisee for the practice of psychology?
- In addition to supervision will other training activities occur that will help prepare the supervisee for the practice of psychology?

Once the supervised professional experience has been completed, the Verification of Experience Form must be completed and signed by the primary supervisor or, if the experience is part of a formal internship, completed and signed by the Director of Training and submitted with the Supervision Agreement Form directly to the Board by the primary supervisor or Director of Training. UNLESS THE FORM REQUIRES PRIOR APPROVAL, DO NOT SEND IN THE SUPERVISION AGREEMENT FORM, UNTIL THE SUPERVISED PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE HAS BEEN CONCLUDED AND THE VERIFICATION OF EXPERIENCE FORM HAS BEEN COMPLETED.

If any hours of supervised professional experience is for a psychological assistant in private practice setting, the Supervision Agreement Form must be completed and

submitted to the Board for prior approval before accruing any SPE hours towards licensure. If any hours of supervised professional experience are in non-mental health services the Supervision Agreement Form in Non-Mental health Services (<u>http://www.psychboard.ca.gov/applicants/spe-sup-agree.pdf</u>) must be completed and submitted to the Board for prior approval before accruing any SPE hours towards licensure.

If any hours of supervised professional experience were accrued prior to January 1, 2005 or if the hours were accrued out of state, the following Verification of Experience Form, we suggest you use the attached link: (http://www.psychboard.ca.gov/applicants/verofexp.pdf).

The Board will deny hours of supervised professional experience when an applicant cannot demonstrate that the requirements of Section 1387 of the California Code of Regulation were met. This includes denying hours when a Supervision Agreement form is not properly completed prior to the accrual of hours.
