

**§ 1382.6. Aging and Long-Term Care Training Requirements.**

~~All~~An ~~persons applying applicant~~ for a ~~license licensure~~ as a psychologist who began ~~their~~ his or her graduate training on or after January 1, 2004, shall, in addition to all other requirements for licensure, have completed coursework in aging and long-term care, which shall include but not be limited to the biological, social, and psychological aspects of aging. For an application filed on and after January 1, 2012, this coursework shall include instruction on the assessment and reporting of, and treatment related to, elder and dependent adult abuse and neglect. ~~and~~ The applicant shall submit documentation thereof ~~of to the~~ Board that meets the requirements of section 2915.5(c) of the Code. ~~The~~ This ~~coursework in aging and long-term care shall be completed after January 1, 2004, and shall consist of not less than at least a combined total of ten (10) contact hours focused on this topic.~~

The coursework shall be:

- (a) taken in fulfillment of ~~other~~ any educational requirements in the applicant's graduate and/or doctoral ~~training degree programs;~~ or
- (b) taken in a ~~separate course approved by the board's recognized continuing education accrediting agency~~ course recognized and accepted by the Board pursuant to section 1397.61(f) [note – this will have to change to section 1397.61(c) after the new CE regs take effect.]; or
- (c) taken in a separate course ~~provided by a sponsor approved by the American Psychological Association~~ sponsored, offered, or approved by a local, county, or state department of health or mental health, or by health agencies of the federal government.
- ~~(d) completed after January 1, 2004.~~
