SB 1238 (Price) – Professions: Board of Psychology: Board of Behavioral Sciences

Introduced February 23, 2012

This bill would extend until January 1, 2017, the provisions establishing the California Board of Psychology (BOP), the Board of Behavioral Sciences (BBS), and extends the term of the executive officers of the BOP and BBS.

An act to amend Sections 2920, 2933, 4990, and 4990.04 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to professions.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1238, as introduced, Price. Professions: Board of Psychology: Board of Behavioral Sciences.

Existing law provides for the licensure and regulation of psychologists by the Board of Psychology. Existing law provides for the licensure and regulation of educational psychologists, social workers, and marriage and family therapists by the Board of Behavioral Sciences within the Department of Consumer Affairs. Existing law specifies the composition of each board and authorizes each board to employ an executive officer. Existing law repeals these provisions on January 1, 2013. Under existing law, boards scheduled for repeal are required to be evaluated by the Joint Sunset Review Committee.

This bill would extend the operation of these provisions until January 1, 2017. This bill would specify that each board is subject to review by the appropriate policy committees of the Legislature.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2920 of the Business and Professions
 Code is amended to read:

1 2920. (a) The Board of Psychology shall enforce and 2 administer this chapter. The board shall consist of nine members, 3 four of whom shall be public members.

17 Civil Service Act, an executive officer to the Board of Psychology.

18 The board shall make all expenditures to carry out this chapter.

19 The board may accept contributions to effectuate the purposes of20 this chapter.

4990. (a) There is in the Department of Consumer Affairs, a

32 (3) Two state licensed marriage and family therapists.

(4) Commencing January 1, 2012, one state licensed professional
 clinical counselor.

36 (b) Each member, except the seven public members, shall have

37 at least two years of experience in his or her profession.

38 (c) Each member shall reside in the State of California.

39 (d) The Governor shall appoint five of the public members and

40 the six licensed members with the advice and consent of the Senate.

The Senate Committee on Rules and the Speaker of the Assembly
 shall each appoint a public member.

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3 (e) Each member of the board shall be appointed for a term of 4 four years. the unexpired term by the authority who appointed the member

(h) Each member of the board shall receive a per diem andreimbursement of expenses as provided in Section 103.

4990.04. (a) The board shall appoint an executive officer. This
position is designated as a confidential position and is exempt from
civil service under subdivision (e) of Section 4 of Article VII of

33 the California Constitution.

34 (b) The executive officer serves at the pleasure of the board.

(c) The executive officer shall exercise the powers and perform
the duties delegated by the board and vested in him or her by this
chapter.

38 (d) With the approval of the director, the board shall fix the39 salary of the executive officer.

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(e) The chairperson and executive officer may call meetings of
 the board and any duly appointed committee at a specified time
 and place. For purposes of this section, "call meetings" means
 setting the agenda, time, date, or place for any meeting of the board
 or any committee.
