SUBJECT:

Consider English as a Second Language as a Basis for an Accommodation in

Taking the Examination

At the last Board meeting, the Board requested additional information from other State Boards regarding their policy concerning examination accommodations for English as a second language (ESL).

Attached is the Board's policy regarding ESL and the results from an email sent to the different State Boards in the Unites States. In addition the following information was gathered from other entities:

- 1. Association for State and Provincial Psychology Board (ASPPB), the Board that administers the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology, does not consider ESL as a disability and that California is the only state that allows exam accommodations for candidates with ESL.
- 2. The Medical Board of California, does not have any regulations/statutes relative to ESL.
- 3. The Board of Behavioral Science use to provide ESL until 07/01/2011. Their requirements for ESL were very similar to our Board's requirement. However, since ESL is not considered a disability BBS eliminated this accommodation for candidates taking their exams.

BOARD POLICY: keasonable Accommodations for Psychology Licensing Examinations

ADOPTED: July 27, 1991

- All examinations (written and oral) will be administered at designated examination sites which will be handicapped accessible. For security reasons, off-site exam administration will not be an option.
- All reasonable accommodations will be made to disabled candidates when proper notice is given and appropriate medical verification of disability is provided well in advance of the examination date.
 - For those disabled candidates requiring a reader, the candidate must provide their own reader who must certify that they have no experience or knowledge of the subject of psychology. The Board will provide a proctor to sit in with the candidate and reader during the taking of the written examination.
- 3. Candidates for the written examination who claim "English as a second language" may be allowed up to two additional hours to take the examination upon adequate prior notice of such need provided both of the following conditions are met:
 - a. The candidate submits proof that original entry into the United States occurred within the last ten years, and
 - b. Original entry into the United States did not occur prior to the candidates's beginning of university training.

Proof will consist of copies of the candidate's entry papers.

PLEASE NOTE:

The written examination results of those candidates who have been granted additional time to take the examination, regardless of the reason, will be reported to the Professional Examination Service as having been completed under non-standard conditions. Their scores will not be used in the computation of the national norms, therefore the candidate must accept responsibility concerning recipracity consideration with other state licensing boards.
