SUBJECT	Agenda Item (g) Discussion and Consideration of Supervised Professional Experience (SPE) 16 CCR Section 1387 – accruing SPE for the Activity of "Supervision"

Attached is section 1387 of the California Code of Regulations with the recommended changes:

Action

To approve the proposed language as written and to give staff the authority to begin the rulemaking process.

- 1 1387. Supervised Professional Experience.
- 2

This section applies to all trainees, pre- or post-doctoral, who intend for hours of 3 4 supervised professional experience (SPE) to count toward meeting the licensing requirement stated in section 2914(c) of the Business and Professions Code. Those 5 6 trainees accruing hours of supervised experience in areas of psychology that do not include direct mental health services should refer to section 1387.3 for information on 7 establishing an alternate plan for SPE. SPE is defined as an organized program that 8 consists of a planned, structured and administered sequence of professionally 9 supervised comprehensive clinical applied training experiences. SPE shall have a 10 logical training sequence that builds upon the skills and competencies of trainees to 11 prepare them for the independent practice of psychology once they become licensed. 12 SPE shall include socialization into the profession of psychology and shall be 13 augmented by integrated modalities including mentoring, didactic exposure, 14 rolemodeling, enactment, observational/vicarious learning, and consultative guidance. 15 SPE shall include activities which that address the integration of psychological concepts 16 and current and evolving competencies, scientific knowledge, principles, and theories to 17 the professional delivery of psychological services to the consumer public. SPE shall 18 include only the time spent by the trainee engaged in psychological activities that 19 directly serve to prepare the trainee for the independent practice of psychology once 20 21 licensed. SPE shall not include custodial tasks such as filing, transcribing or other clerical duties. The term "trainee" as used in these regulations means a psychology 22 trainee working under one of the conditions listed in subsections (a)(1) and (a)(2) of this 23 24 section.
