




- Significant shortage of behavioral health providers








Age Distribution of Behavioral Health Professionals, 2105-2020


Race/Ethnicity of Active Patient Care Psychiatrists, 2020




Race/Ethnicity, Non-Prescribing Behavioral Health Professionals, California, 2015-2019




Projected Demand and Supply for Psychiatrists for 2016 and 2028






Projected Demand and Supply for Clinical Psychologists, LMFTs, LPCCs, and LCSW's for 2016 and 2028












The largest drops in enrollment were among adults 50 and older.

Conclusions

- Some regions of California have small numbers of behavioral health professionals per capita relative to the state overall.
- Many behavioral health professionals are at or near retirement age.
- The behavioral workforce does not reflect the racial/ethnic and linguistic diversity of the state's population, especially in professions that require a doctoral degree.
- Numbers of graduates of educational programs will not be sufficient to replace retirees or meet growing demand for behavioral health services.
- Existing sources of data are not sufficient to fully assess California's behavioral health workforce needs.

Recommendations

- Invest in behavioral health professions education pipeline programs which focus on underrepresented and lowincome persons, especially at college and post-baccalaureate levels
- Increase funding for psychiatry residency programs and psychiatric nurse practitioner education programs
- Provide funds for targeted increases in enrollment at Community Colleges and California medical and nursing schools



Recommendations specific to behavioral health

- Pilot the Cal-HOSA Prevention and Early Intervention Mental Health and Workforce Development Model in middle and high schools
- Promote careers in behavioral health among college students
- Increase funding for stipends and scholarships for behavioral heath professions students
- Increase psychiatry residency positions
- Establish a new psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner education program
- Expand train-the-trainer model for increase primary care providers' ability to meet behavioral health workforce needs
- Scale engagement of peer providers through certification, training, and reimbursement

(Chapter 6.6 repealed and added by Stats. 1967, Ch. 1677.)

ARTICLE 7. Revenue [2980 - 2989]

(Article 7 added by Stats. 1967, Ch. 1677.)

2987.

The amount of the fees prescribed by this chapter shall be determined by the board, and shall be as follows:

(a) The application fee for a psychologist shall <u>be not be more than fifty dollars (\$50)two</u> <u>hundred and thirty-six dollars (\$236).</u>

(b) The examination and reexamination fees for the examinations shall be the actual cost to the board of developing, purchasing, and grading of each examination, plus the actual cost to the board of administering each examination.

(c) The application fee for the California Psychology Law and Ethics Examination (CPLEE) shall be one hundred and twenty-seven dollars (\$127).

(d)(c) The initial license fee is an amount equal to the renewal fee in effect on the last regular renewal date before the date on which the license is issued. The initial license fee for a psychologist shall be two hundred and thirty-one dollars (\$231).

(e)(d) The biennial renewal fee for a psychologist shall be four hundred dollars (\$400)seven hundred and ninety-five dollars (\$795). The board may increase the renewal fee to an amount not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500). The board may adopt regulations to set the fee at a higher amount, up to a maximum of one thousand one hundred dollars (\$1,100).

(f)(e) The application fee for registration as a registered psychological associate under Section 2913 shall not be more than seventy-five dollars (\$75).be four hundred and twenty-four dollars (\$424).

(g)(f) The annual renewal fee for registration of a psychological assistant shall <u>be not be</u> more than seventy-five dollars (\$75). two hundred and twenty four dollars (\$224). The board may adopt regulations to set the fee at a higher amount, up to a maximum of four hundred dollars (\$400).

(h)(g) The duplicate license or registration fee is five dollars (\$5).

(i)(h) The delinquency fee is 50 percent of the renewal fee for each license type, not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150).

(i)(i) The endorsement fee is five dollars (\$5).

(k)(i) The file transfer fee is ten dollars (\$10).

(I) The fee for Fingerprint Hard Card Processing for Out of State Applicants shall be one hundred and eighty-four dollars (\$184). Applicants shall also pay the actual cost to the

board of processing the fingerprint hard card with the Department of Justice and Federal Bureau of Investigation.

(m) The fee for a psychological associate to add or change their supervisor shall be two hundred and ten dollars (\$210). The fee shall be the actual cost to the board of processing the addition or change.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the board may reduce any fee prescribed by this section, when, in its discretion, the board deems it administratively appropriate.

(Amended by Stats. 2021, Ch. 647, Sec. 19. (SB 801) Effective January 1, 2022.)

A licensed psychologist who for reasons, including, but not limited to, retirement, ill health, or absence from the state, is not engaged in the practice of psychology, may apply to the board to request that his or her license be placed on an inactive status. A licensed psychologist who holds an inactive license shall pay a biennial renewal fee, fixed by the board, of no more than forty dollars (\$40)of two hundred and twenty one dollars (\$221). The board may adopt regulations to set the fee at a higher amount, up to a maximum of four hundred dollars (\$400). A psychologist holding an inactive license shall be exempt from continuing education requirements specified in Section 2915, but shall otherwise be subject to this chapter and shall not engage in the practice of psychology in this state. Licensees on inactive status who have not committed any acts or crimes constituting grounds for denial of licensure and have completed the continuing education requirements specified in Section 2915 may, upon their request have their license to practice psychology placed on active status.

Introduced by Assembly Member Aguiar-Curry

An act to amend Section 2914 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to healing arts.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 282, as introduced, Aguiar-Curry. Psychologists: licensure.

Existing law, the Psychology Licensing Law, establishes the Board of Psychology to license and regulate the practice of psychology. Existing law requires each applicant for licensure as a psychologist to take and pass any examination required by the board, except as exempted by the board under existing law. Existing law prescribes additional requirements for licensure, including a requirement that an applicant for licensure have earned a doctoral degree in any of specified fields of study.

This bill would make an applicant for licensure who has completed all coursework required for such a doctoral degree, as documented by a written certification from the registrar of the applicant's educational institution or program, eligible to take any and all examinations required for licensure.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

RE: Licensing Process Improvement Legislation

Dear Dr. Tate,

CPA is sponsoring legislation intended to modify the licensure process at the Board of Psychology (BOP) in order to promote efficiency in the overall process for becoming licensed as a psychologist.

A member survey conducted by CPA in 2022 found significant wait times at each step in the licensing process at the BOP, resulting in delays to consumers accessing treatment and creating a financial burden for applicants due to lost opportunities for income. Survey results indicated that each sequential step in the licensure process typically took 2-4 months to process, for a total wait time often lasting about one year. In addition, almost 60% reported that the delays created financial hardship and over 30% reported the delays caused interruptions in patient care.

To reduce delays, CPA will propose amending B & P § 2914 to allow applicants for psychology licensure to take the required examinations (CPLEE and EPPP) at any time after completing all coursework for a qualifying doctoral degree, rather than in a set sequence with each step requiring review and approval by BOP staff.

The intent of this legislation is to streamline the licensure process to reduce burdensome wait times for applicants and to improve access to care. It could also reduce the workload for licensing staff at the BOP.

In addition, the bill would require the Board of Psychology to revise CCR § 1388 (Examinations), consistent with our bill, to clarify that licensure examinations can be taken at any time after completing the required coursework for a qualifying doctoral degree.

We look forward to discussing this legislative proposal and request that this be placed on the agenda for the next Board of Psychology meeting.

Proposed CPA Language

<u>2914</u>

(a) An applicant for licensure shall not be subject to denial of licensure under Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475).

(b) (1) On and after January 1, 2020, an applicant for licensure shall possess an earned doctoral degree in any of the following:

(A) Psychology with the field of specialization in clinical, counseling, school, consulting, forensic, industrial, or organizational psychology.

(B) Education with the field of specialization in counseling psychology, educational psychology, or school psychology.

(C) A field of specialization designed to prepare graduates for the professional practice of psychology.

(2) (A) Except as provided in subparagraph (B), the degree or training obtained pursuant to paragraph (1) shall be obtained from a college or institution of higher education that is accredited by a regional accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education.

(B) Subparagraph (A) does not apply to any student who was enrolled in a doctoral program in psychology with the field of specialization in clinical, counseling, school, consulting, forensic, industrial, or organizational psychology or in education with the field of specialization in counseling psychology, educational psychology, or school psychology at a nationally accredited or approved institution as of December 31, 2016.

(3) The board shall make the final determination as to whether a degree meets the requirements of this subdivision.

(4) Until January 1, 2020, the board may accept an applicant who possesses a doctoral degree in psychology, educational psychology, or in education with the field of specialization in counseling psychology or educational psychology from an institution that is not accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education, but is approved to operate in this state by the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education on or before July 1, 1999, and has not, since July 1, 1999, had a new location, as described in Section 94823.5 of the Education Code.

(5) An applicant for licensure trained in an educational institution outside the United States or Canada shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the board that the applicant possesses a doctoral degree in psychology or education as specified in paragraphs (1) and (2) that is equivalent to a degree earned from a regionally accredited academic institution in the United States or Canada by providing the board with an evaluation of the degree by a foreign credential evaluation service that is a member of the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES), or by the National Register of Health Services Psychologists (NRHSP), and any other documentation the board deems necessary. The member of the NACES or the NRHSP shall submit the evaluation to the board directly and shall include in the evaluation all of the following:

(A) A transcript in English, or translated into English by the credential evaluation service, of the degree used to qualify for licensure.

(B) An indication that the degree used to qualify for licensure is verified using primary sources.

(C) A determination that the degree is equivalent to a degree that qualifies for licensure pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (2).

(c) (1) An applicant for licensure shall have engaged for at least two years in supervised professional experience under the direction of a licensed psychologist, the specific requirements of which shall be defined by the board in its regulations, or under suitable alternative supervision as determined by the board in regulations duly adopted under this chapter, at least one year of which shall have occurred after the applicant was awarded the qualifying doctoral degree. Any supervision may be provided in real time, which is defined as through in-person or synchronous audiovisual means, in compliance with federal and state laws related to patient health confidentiality. The supervisor shall submit verification of the experience to the trainee as prescribed by the board. If the supervising licensed psychologist fails to provide verification to the trainee in a timely manner, the board may establish alternative procedures for obtaining the necessary documentation. Absent good cause, the failure of a supervising licensed psychologist to provide the verification to the board upon request shall constitute unprofessional conduct.

(2) The board shall establish qualifications by regulation for supervising psychologists.

(d) An applicant for licensure shall take and pass the examination required by Section 2941 unless otherwise exempted by the board under this chapter. An applicant for licensure who has completed all coursework required for a doctoral degree as required by paragraph (b), as documented by a written certification from the registrar of their educational institution or program, shall be eligible to take any and all examinations required for licensure.

(e) An applicant for licensure shall complete coursework or provide evidence of training in the detection and treatment of alcohol and other chemical substance dependency.

(f) An applicant for licensure shall complete coursework or provide evidence of training in spousal or partner abuse assessment, detection, and intervention.

Background

This package was introduced based upon Senate Bill 1193 (SB 1193) (Hill, Chapter 484, Statutes of 2016) and Senate Bill 547 (SB 547) (Hill, Chapter 429, Statutes of 2017), and was originally approved by the Board November 16, 2018. Two forms were incorporated by this regulatory proposal, although not separately displayed in the meeting materials or minutes:

- Application for Registration as a Psychological Assistant (PSB 100 (Rev. 7/17))
- Notification to Add or Change a Supervisor or Service Location for a Psychological Assistant (PSB 101 (Rev. 7/17))

At the time of original adoption, the fee for the "Application for Registration as a Psychological Assistant" was \$40.

Work was postponed on this package while Senate Bill 801 (SB 801) (Archuleta, Chapter 647, Statues of 2021) was drafted, pursued, signed, and implemented, and some non-substantive changes to the regulatory text occurred based on the statutory revisions (such as revising references from *Assistant* to *Associate*) in the Fall of 2021. The two forms were re-titled / re-dated:

- Application for Registration as a Psychological Associate (PSB 100 (New 2021))
- Notification to Add or Change a Supervisor or Service Location for a Psychological Associate (PSB 101 (New 2021)

California Board of PSYCHOLOGY

With those changes made to the regulatory text, the regulatory package was forwarded to the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs on April 26, 2022, and, after her approval, to the Secretary of the Business, Consumer Services, and Housing Agency on May 6, 2022, who approved the package to go to Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for publication on Jun 6, 2022.

The Board has successfully pursued a separate regulatory fee change to 16 CCR 1392.1 in 2021-2022 (notice to the public for comment on December 7, 2021, submitted to OAL March 28, 2022, approved May 5, 2022, and effective July 1, 2022), which updated the \$40 application fee to \$75.00. An additional change, mirrored in the main Psychological Associate package, was also made via a "change without regulatory effect" to section 1391.5(c) (deleting a reference to organizations specified in section 2913 of the Code), which was submitted to OAL on July 20, 2022, and approved and effective August 30, 2022.

This package was submitted to OAL in December (OAL file #2022-1212-03S) and, based upon conversations with them, is being brought back to the Board for some clarifying changes, which will require a 15-day public comment period.

The modified text:

If, after the 15-day public comment period, no relevant timely adverse comments are received, adopt the amendments to Sections 1391.1, 1391.2, 1391.5, 1391.6, 1391.8, 1391.10, 1391.11, 1391.12, and 1392.1, including the incorporated forms, as modified, and authorize the Executive Officer to take all steps necessary to resubmit the rulemaking package to the Office of Administrative Law to complete the rulemaking process, including making any technical or non-substantive changes to the proposed regulations as necessary.

EXPLANATION OF CHANGES

The Board provides this explanation for the modified text.

Changes to the regulatory text

- A change without regulatory effect to subdivision (c) of section 1391.5 (deleting a reference to organizations specified in section 2913 of the Code) was submitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) on July 20, 2022, and approved and effective August 30, 2022. This obviated the need to delete "employed by one of the organizations specified in section 2913 of the Code" in this rulemaking and that text has been deleted from the modified text as a technical update.
- A minor technical edit was made to section 1391.11(a) and (b), to correct a comma placement after the quoted incorporated form name and to add the word "section" before referenced 1391.1, to conform with the otherwise referenced regulatory sections.
- A separate regulatory package which updated the fee amounts and the authority and reference citations in 1392.1. was noticed to the public for comment on December 7, 2021, submitted to OAL March 28, 2022, approved May 5, 2022, and effective July 1, 2022. The current regulatory text has been updated to the current law.

As part of the modified text, the Board is proposing to change Forms PSB 100 (New 2021) and PSB 101 (New 2021). Because of formatting issues, the two documents are being replaced and added, rather than amended, as described below.

- (b) The supervisor shall <u>inform_ensure that</u> each client or patient <u>is informed</u>, prior to the rendering of services by the registered psychological associate, that the associate is unlicensed and is under the direction and supervision of the supervisor. as an employee Each client or patient shall also be informed and that the supervisor shall have access to the <u>client's or patient's chart in fulfilling their supervisoryion</u> duties.
- (c) The supervisor shall be available to the registered psychological associate 100% of the time the associate is performing psychological functions. The availability can be in-person, by telephone, by pager or by other appropriate technology.
- (d) The supervisor shall ensure that a plan is in place to protect the <u>client or patient-or client</u> in the event a <u>client or patient/client</u> crisis or emergency occurs during any time the supervisor is not physically present at the established site at which the supervisee is working. The supervisor shall ensure that the supervisee thoroughly understands the plan in the event a <u>client or patient crisis</u> or emergency occurs.

A new supervision agreement is required, pursuant to section 1387, if there has been a change of supervisor and the registered psychological associate is accruing supervised professional experience.



The Enforcement Committee and staff began a comprehensive review of the California Code of Regulations sections 1397.35-1397.40. The Committee does recommend minor changes to some of these sections.

In 16 CCR section 1397.35 – Requirements for Professional Corporations, the Committee recommends updating the list of licensees who can be a shareholder in a professional corporation to match the statutory language in the Corporations Code (subdivision (c) of Section 13401.5, as shown in the attachment to Agenda Item 17(b)). Because the authorizing Business and Professions Code statute (Section 2995, described in Agenda Item 17(a)) also needs minor clean-up, staff recommends updating the statute first and then the regulation to follow.

In 16 CCR section 1397.37 – Shares: Ownership and Transfer, the Committee recommended updating the pronouns "his or her" or "he or she" with the gender neutral pronouns "their" or "they," respectively. This nonsubstantive change was submitted to the Office of Administrative Law and approved, effective January 19, 2023.

In 16 CCR section 1397.39 – Corporate Activities, the Committee recommended inserting serial commas for clarity. This nonsubstantive change was submitted to the Office of Administrative Law and approved, effective January 19, 2023.

The Committee had no recommended changes to 16 CCR section 1397.40 – Trusts.
