SUBJECT	Agenda Item (4) Discussion and Consideration of Business & Professions Code Section 2903 – Licensure Requirement; Practice of Psychology; Psychotherapy; Fee

Attached is section 2903 of the Business and Professions Code with the recommended changes.

<u>Action</u>

To approve the proposed language as written and to give staff the authority to begin the rulemaking process.

Licensure Requirement; Practice of Psychology; Psychotherapy; Fee 1 2 § 2903. No person may engage in the practice of psychology, or represent himself or 3 herself to be a psychologist, without a license granted under this chapter, except as 4 otherwise provided in this chapter. The practice of psychology is defined as rendering or 5 offering to render for a fee to individuals, groups, organizations or the public any 6 psychological service involving the application of psychological principles, methods, and 7 procedures of understanding, predicting, and influencing behavior, such as the 8 principles pertaining to learning, perception, motivation, emotions, and interpersonal 9 relationships; and the methods and procedures of interviewing, counseling, 10 11 psychotherapy, behavior modification, and hypnosis; and of constructing, administering, and interpreting tests of mental abilities, aptitudes, interests, attitudes, personality 12 13 characteristics, emotions, and motivations. The application of these principles and methods includes, but is not restricted to: assessment, diagnosis, prevention, treatment, 14 and amelioration intervention in order to increase effective functioning of individuals, 15 groups, and organizations of psychological problems and emotional and mental 16 disorders of individuals and groups. Psychotherapy within the meaning of this chapter 17 means the use of psychological methods in a formal professional relationship to assist a 18 person or persons to acquire greater human effectiveness or to modify feelings, 19 conditions, attitudes and behavior which are emotionally, intellectually, or socially 20 ineffectual or maladjustive maladaptive. 21 As used in this chapter, "fee" means any charge, monetary or otherwise, whether paid 22

directly or paid on a prepaid or capitation basis by a third party, or a charge assessed
