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92 Mr. Glasspiegel provided the Board with an update on the bill stating that it is currently 93 on the Senate Floor, pending the Legislature's return from Recess. The bill will be heard no later than September 15th, as that is the last day for all bills to be heard. 94

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b) Review and Consideration of Committee Recommendations on Legislation

98 1) Review of Bills with Active Positions Approved by the Board: 99

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A. AB 244 (Cervantes) - Maternal Mental Health

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102 Mr. Glasspiegel provided an overview of the bill stating this bill would create a pilot 103 program in counties that elect to participate to increase the capacity of health providers 104 that serve pregnant and postpartum women up to one year after delivery to effectively 105 prevent, identify, and manage postpartum depression. He provided a short history of the bill to the Board stating that on April 21, 2017, the Board took a position of "Support if 106 107 amended" and instructed staff to seek specified amendments to add "postpartum" and 108 "psychological" to the bill. Staff reached out to the author's office to discuss the 109 amendments and was informed that the bill is now a two-year bill. Mr. Glasspiegel 110 stated that staff will stay in contact with the author when the Senate returns from recess. 111 112 B. AB 1456 (Low) – Professional Licensure 113 Ms. Jones provided an overview of this bill and stated that at the June Board Meeting, 114 115 the Board took a Support position on this bill. Mr. Glasspiegel provided the Board with 116 an update on the bill indicating it was signed by the Governor on July 21, 2017, and the 117 bill will become effective January 1, 2018. 118 119 Ms. Sorrick stated staff will be releasing an advisory on the Board's website and in a 120 journal article to notify consumers of the exemption waiver change to five years. 121 122 C. AB 710 (Wood) – Department of Consumer Affairs: Board Meetings 123 124 Ms. Jones provided a quick overview of the bill stating that this bill would require every Board to meet once every other calendar year in rural California. 125 126 127 Mr. Glasspiegel stated the author cancelled the hearing. He explained that when an author cancels the hearing, it means the author either has no desire to pursue the bill in 128 129 its current form or could be making substantive changes and will reintroduce the bill at a 130 later date. 131 132 D. AB 1188 (Nazarian) – Health Professions Development: Loan Repayment 133 134 Ms. Jones stated this bill would increase the Mental Health Practitioner Education Fund 135 fee from \$10.00 to \$20.00. 136

Mr. Glasspiegel stated the Board took a Support position at the April 21, 2017 Board
 Meeting and the hearing is set for Senate Appropriations on August 21, 2017.

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 140 <u>E. SB 547 (Hill) Professions and Vocations: Weights and Measures (Board Omnibus</u>
 141 Bill)
- 142

Mr. Glasspiegel stated the bill would amend the specification in statute for who can pay the psychological assistant registration fee to the Board and would specify that the delinquency fee for Board licensees is 50 percent of the renewal fee for each license type, not to exceed \$150.00. He stated the bill is currently in the Assembly Committee on Appropriations and the hearing was set for August 23, 2017. He indicated that staff will testify and continue to provide the Board with updates as this bill moves forward.

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 - F. SB 572 (Stone) Healing Arts Licensees: Violations: Grace Period
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Mr. Glasspiegel provided an overview of the bill stating this bill would prohibit healing
arts boards under the Department of Consumer Affairs from issuing a disciplinary action
or otherwise penalizing a licensee who commits a violation that does not cause
irreparable harm to a consumer and is remedied within 15 days. On August 1, 2017,
staff confirmed with the author that this bill is no longer being pursued. Staff will
continue to watch the bill until it dies, making sure that the bill is not moved in current
form.

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160 <u>G. SB 798 (Hill) – Healing Arts: Boards</u>

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Mr. Glasspiegel stated this bill is the Sunset Bill for the Medical Board of California,
which previously included provisions transferring the licensing and regulation of
Research Psychoanalysts to the Board of Psychology. He stated that on July 6, 2017,
the provisions transferring the Research Psychoanalyst registration program to the
Board were removed from the bill due to concerns by stakeholders in the research
psychoanalyst community, as expressed in the letter to the author by the University of
Southern California.

 175 Dr. Jo Linder-Crow, California Psychological Association (CPA), addressed the board
 176 regarding the bill. She stated that CPA had concerns about the part of the bill dealing
 177 with disclosure of client records.
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179 2) Review of Watch Bills

181 XX. – SB 755 (Beall) Civil Discovery: Mental Examination

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Mr. Glasspiegel provided an overview of the bill. He stated the Board's three areas of 184 concern with the bill are: use of the term clinical psychologist, limiting psychologists' ability to practice within their scope of competence, and a lack of awareness of the 185 186 Board's complaint process. He indicated that, with the assistance of Dr. Horn, staff 187 composed a letter to the author and sponsor of SB 755 that would relay the Board's concerns. Ms. Sorrick provided an update on the bill stating it was signed by the 188 189 Governor on July 24, 2017, and the bill will become effective January 1, 2018. 190 191 Dr. Horn spoke about the conversation she and staff had with the author and sponsor of the bill. She stated that the Board's concerns were communicated and staff provided 192 information about the appropriate avenues one can take against a licensee who abuses 193 194 the mental examination process. 195 196 197 AAA. ACR 8 (Jones-Sawyer) - Adverse Childhood Experiences: Post-Traumatic 198 "Street" Disorder 199 200 Dr. Horn asked staff for an update on this resolution. She indicated that she was informed that on July 13, 2017 the bill was amended to remove referenced to adverse 201 202 childhood experiences as a mental health condition. 203 204 Mr. Glasspiegel read the full text of the bill to the Board. 205 206 Dr. Horn stated that adverse childhood experiences are not only occurring for kids who 207 are on the street. She stated that this resolution is only focusing on one aspect but there 208 others adverse childhood experiences. Dr. Horn agrees that adverse child experience 209 can potentially lead to PTSD, but this resolution emphasizes only one aspect of a 210 broader issue. 211 212 Discussion ensued about the term post-traumatic street disorder, how it may be too 213 technical and whether a position should be taken. Mr. Foo reminded the Board the nature of the resolution is to highlight a specific matter. The Board came to a consensus 214 that no position will be taken and agreed that the intent of the resolution is to bring 215 216 awareness to a particular issue that is not getting enough attention. 217 218 Dr. Jo Linder-Crow, CPA, stated CPA had concerns with the resolution considering this 219 as a mental health diagnosis and changed to a neutral position when the author took 220 that out. She stated that the purpose of the bill is to raise awareness to an issue. 221 c) Update Regarding the California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act (CANRA) 222 223 and Mandated Reporting - Penal Code Sections 261.5, 288, and 11165.1. 224 Mr. Glasspiegel stated that there is no new information to provide on this issue. He 225 reminded the Board that the California Supreme Court granted the petition for review of 226 the Mathews v. Harris case. 227 228

Regulatory Update, Review, and Consideration of Additional Changes (Jones) 231 232 a) Update on 16 CCR Sections 1391.1, 1391.2, 1391.5, 1391.6, 1391.8, 1391.10, 233 1391.11, 1391.12, 1392.1 – Psychological Assistants 234 Mr. Glasspiegel informed the Board that this regulatory package is currently being 235 236 reviewed by Legal Counsel as of August 3, 2017. 237 238 b) Update on 16 CCR Sections 1387(b)(10)(11) and 1387.1 - Verification of Experience and Supervision Agreement Forms 239 240 241 Mr. Glasspiegel informed the Board that this regulatory package was approved by the Office of Administrative Law on June 5, 2017 and will become effective October 1, 242 243 2017. He indicated that staff is working on sending out a regulatory advisory. 244 245 7. Consideration of Amendments to Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR) Sections 1381.9, 1397.67, 1397.69 - Canceled Licenses and Reapplication 246 247 248 Ms. McCockran addressed the Board regarding the proposed amendments to Title 16 of 249 the California Code of Regulations relating to canceled licenses and reapplication. b) Committee Updates

Dr. Phillips stated that he and the members of the Licensing Committee are excited to have Mr. Foo join the Licensing Committee.

Dr. Jo Linder-Crow, CPA, asked what kind of follow up staff was conducting with the Office of the Governor regarding the two licensed vacancies on the Board and expressed her concern that the Board is missing a licensed members' perspective. Dr. Phillips confirmed that he had been in touch with the Governor's Appointments office and stressed the committee workload of the appointed members and that a full complement of members was desired.
