36 Dr. Rodgers called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. A quorum was present, and due
37 notice had been sent to all interested parties.

39 **Agenda Item #2: President's Welcome**

41 Dr. Rodgers made opening remarks and led a mindfulness exercise.
42

43 Mr. Foo arrived and joined the meeting at 9:15 a.m.
44

45 **Agenda Item #3: Public Comment for Items Not on the Agenda**

46

47 Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

48

49 No public comment was offered.

50

51 **Agenda Item #4: Discussion and Possible Approval of the Board Meeting**

52 **Minutes: November 6-7, 2025**

54 Dr. Rodgers introduced this item, starting on page 14 of the meeting materials.

55

56 Dr. Rodgers called for Board comment.

57

58 Dr. Harb Sheets called for a correction regarding the acronym for the Integrated
59 Examination for Professional Practice of Psychology (IEPPP).

60

61 No further Board comment was offered.

62

63 It was (M)Foo(S)Casuga(C) to approve as amended, the November 6-7, 2025, Board
64 Meeting minutes.

65

66 Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

67

68 No public comment was offered.

73 **Agenda Item #5: President's Report**

75 a) Meeting Calendar

76

77 Dr. Rodgers provided an update on this item, found on page 31 of the meeting
78 materials.

79

80 Dr. Rodgers called for Board comment.

81

82 Dr. Casuga questioned whether future Board meetings would be kept to a single day.

83

84 Dr. Rodgers replied that this would be the case unless a single day was insufficient for
85 completing the Board's business.

86

87 No further Board comment was offered.

88

89 Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

90

91 No public comment was offered.

92

93 **Agenda Item #6: Executive Officer's Report**

94

95 Mr. Burke provided the update on this item, starting on page one of the first hand-carry
96 packet.

97

98 a) Personnel Updates

99

100 Mr. Burke commented that the board was seeking to fill two positions in the
101 Enforcement Unit.

102

103 b) Communications with Other Jurisdictions Regarding Examination Development

104

105 Mr. Burke called for Board questions.

106

107 Dr. Harb Sheets asked whether it was the intention of the Texas Board to offer both
108 examinations as options for licensees there.

109

110 Mr. Burke confirmed that this was the case.

111

112 Dr. Rodgers called for Board comment.

113

114 No further Board comment was offered.

115

116 Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

117

118 The first commenter asked whether California would accept the alternative examination
119 offered by Texas for licensure here.

120

121 Mr. Burke commented that the Board had not yet discussed that. He explained that
122 statutory changes would be necessary for California to accept any alternative
123 examination, as would be the case even to admit the IEPPP.

124

125 No further public comment was offered.

126

127 **Agenda Item #7: DCA Update**

128

129 Lucia Saldivar, Deputy Director of Board and Bureau Relations at Department of
130 Consumer Affairs (DCA) presented this item.

131

132 Ms. Saldivar commented that Chief Deputy Director Christine Lally was named the
133 Acting Director of DCA following the retirement of Director Kimberly Kirchmeyer.

134
135 Ms. Salvidar commented that DCA sent out renewal notices to licensees advising them
136 to renew following the one-year postponement in place as a response to the fires in
137 Southern California.

138
139 Ms. Saldivar commented on the July 1, 2026, effective date for the Business, Consumer
140 Services, and Housing Agency to be split into two new agencies, namely the California
141 Housing and Homelessness Agency, and the Business and Consumer Services
142 Agency.

143
144 Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

145
146 No public comment was offered.

147
148 **Agenda Item #8: Budget Report**

149
150 Emily Molino, Budget Analyst with the DCA Budget Office, along with Suzanne Balkis,
151 Budget Manager, provided the update on this item, starting on page 32 of the meeting
152 materials.

153
154 Mr. Foo asked about the possibility that the Board would have to revert money to the
155 general fund, given the state's current deficit outlook.

156
157 Ms. Balkis commented that there was currently no discussion about this possibility.

158
159 Mr. Foo asked for an update on Fi\$Cal.

160
161 Ms. Balkis confirmed that prior issues with the accounting system had been resolved.

162
163 No further Board comments were offered.

164
165 Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

166
167 The commenter asked whether the general fund tapping into the Board's special fund
168 would lead to increases to fees.

169
170 Mr. Foo commented that any licensing increase would have to go through the statutory
171 process.

172
173 No further public comment was offered.

174
175 **Agenda Item #9: Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) Presentation – Loan**
176 **Repayment Program Update, Update Related to Education Capacity Expansion**

177 **Programs, and Updates on Social Work Initiatives and Funding Sources Not**
178 **Available to Psychologists**

179
180 Dr. Rodgers introduced Michelle Crouch and Nadia Leslie from HCAI to present this
181 item, found in the second set of hand-carry materials.

182
183 Dr. Harb Sheets asked for confirmation that the fees the Board of Psychology and the
184 Board of Behavioral Sciences (BBS) pay into the HCAI program are kept separate.

185
186 Dr. Casuga asked whether adjustments might be made to a psychologist's service
187 period to accommodate life changes or other commitments.

188
189 Ms. Crouch confirmed that this was the case.

190
191 Dr. Casuga asked whether feedback is provided to applicants who were not approved
192 for the program as to why they were not selected.

193
194 Ms. Crouch explained that normally the applicant receives a notification and added that
195 applicants are welcome to call and discuss any deficiencies.

196
197 Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

198
199 No public comment was offered.

200
201 Dr. Casuga asked whether HCAI seeks out additional funding beyond what the Board
202 and BBS pay into it, and whatever other funds might be donated or provided through
203 grants.

204
205 Ms. Crouch confirmed that this was the case.

206
207 Dr. Rodgers asked whether HCAI has relationships with other professional
208 organizations such that they could help get the word out about this program.

209
210 Ms. Crouch replied that HCAI has a marketing team, and that she could provide more
211 information at a later date.

212
213 **Agenda Item #15: Update and Discussion on the Development of the Integrated**
214 **Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology**

215
216 *[This item was taken out of order]*

217
218 Dr. Rodgers introduced Dr. Hao Song, Associate Executive Officer of Examination
219 Services from the Association for State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB) to
220 present this item, found in the third set of hand-carry materials.

221

222 Dr. Harb Sheets asked for an explanation as to why passing rates have dropped off
223 dramatically over the past twenty years and raised the concern that the IEPPP could
224 potentially contribute to further declines.
225

226 Dr. Song replied that scores dropped off during the COVID years, and other contributing
227 factors might include an increase in credit vs. no-credit examinations, as well as
228 examinees not availing themselves of the sample examinations.
229

230 Dr. Harb Sheets asked for Dr. Song's impression of how the questions might have
231 changed and noted her personal experience taking a mock version of the examination
232 with other licensees, in which many of the participants received surprisingly poor
233 scores.
234

235 Dr. Jacqueline Horn commented that, from 2002 to 2015, a different test vendor
236 developed the test with graduate students in mind, and the questions therefore fell
237 outside of what an examinee might expect to encounter. When ASPPB chose Pearson
238 VUE as the new vendor, the quality of the questions increased, though not necessarily
239 their difficulty.
240

241 Dr. Cervantes asked Dr. Horn to clarify her use of the term 'pretest'.
242

243 Dr. Horn explained that the examinations included operational and 'pretest' items, with
244 the latter being included in the test, but not counting towards the final score.
245

246 Dr. Cervantes asked how news of the availability of the sample test was shared,
247 because to her view, not many educators in the psychology field were aware of this.
248

249 Dr. Horn said there was information on the ASPPB website, if only people would look for
250 it there.
251

252 Dr. Song commented that ASPPB, through its town halls, and by appearing at
253 Association conventions, does try to connect with the community and to spread the
254 word about what to expect to see in the future.
255

256 Dr. Casuga asked whether there were plans to translate the examination to languages
257 beyond English and French, namely into Spanish.
258

259 Dr. Song replied that other languages could be served as needed.
260

261 Dr. Casuga asked how the increased complexity of questions on the IEPPP might
262 impact the length of time needed to complete the examination.
263

264 Dr. Song explained that the average time to answer each question is calculated to
265 prevent an examinee from feeling hurried, while giving them ample time to demonstrate
266 their competencies.
267

268 Dr. Casuga commented that a projected implementation date of 2027 was extremely
269 fast, and that the regulatory process would need more time, closer to three years, to
270 properly implement the IEPPP.
271

272 Dr. Song replied that the EPPP is still current, and that to call it the 'IEPPP' is to
273 acknowledge that there is overlap between the old and new examinations.
274

275 Dr. Casuga asked how many questions are on the sample examination.
276

277 Dr. Song replied that there are typically about half as many questions as the actual test,
278 so around a hundred questions.
279

280 Dr. Casuga commented that more people might access the sample examination if it
281 were free, thus resulting in a higher passing rate across diverse socioeconomic
282 populations.
283

284 Dr. Song commented that the sample examination is provided at cost, but that she
285 would take Dr. Casuga's comments back with her.
286

287 Dr. Harb Sheets commented that the Board has been working toward making it possible
288 for applicants to take the examination as soon as they had completed their coursework;
289 however, with the addition of a skills portion in the IEPPP, there is concern about the
290 impact it would have on examinees if they had to wait until after accruing their
291 postdoctoral hours before they could take the test.
292

293 Dr. Song replied that it is ASPPB's recommendation to follow this timeline, but that it is
294 ultimately up to the states or provinces to decide.
295

296 Mr. Foo asked when the cost information would be available to share with the public.
297

298 Dr. Song replied that it would be shared in about a month.
299

300 Mr. Foo asked for a breakdown of the demographics of the test writers, namely as
301 accredited vs. non-accredited.
302

303 Dr. Horn replied that when ASPPB issues a call for volunteers, there is a survey to get a
304 sense of individual backgrounds and competencies.
305

306 Mr. Foo read a question submitted in writing regarding the amount of time a test taker
307 would typically need to prepare for the examination.
308

309 Dr. Song commented that test takers can answer a post-examination survey question
310 about how long they prepared before they sat for the examination, and added that she
311 would need to go back and look at the responses to be able to answer this question.
312

313 Mr. Foo shared his impression that the questions ASPPB chose to address during the
314 town hall tended to be on the simpler side, and that there should have been the option
315 for additional questions to be answered offline and shared later.

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Dr. Song replied that the hour-long town hall format was simply inadequate to answer everyone's questions, but that all questions were recorded and would form the basis of an FAQ.

Mr. Foo asked whether ASPPB would consider having a transition year to enable applicants currently in their coursework to take the old EPPP while putting the IEPPP out for the next crop of applicants.

Dr. Song confirmed that ASPPB was planning a transitional year as described.

Mr. Foo commented to Mr. Burke that the Board should consider an action item at a future meeting to discuss the Board's expectations of what such a transitional period should look like.

Dr. Rodgers asked Dr. Horn to describe the type of training the test writers receive.

Dr. Song replied that test writers receive training in writing style, and for the recognition of unconscious bias, and then everyone gathers together to "group-review" all submissions for adherence to the style manual.

Dr. Rodgers asked how one applied to become a test writer, namely, what were the selection criteria.

Dr. Song replied that interested individuals submit a Curriculum Vitae, and may be asked to write a short paragraph describing their interest in participating in the program. Writers commit to a three-year term, and committee members commit to a four-year term.

Dr. Casuga commented that the sooner ASPPB could release an implementation plan, the sooner the Board could start preparing a transition overlap plan.

Dr. Rodgers called for Board comment.

No further Board comment was offered.

Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

Dr. Jack Aamot expressed his concern on behalf of colleagues who were highly competent, but were not strong test-takers, and conversely that he knew several less-accomplished clinicians who were very successful test-takers. He added that the examination seems to use quantitative measures on qualitative things, and that this application does not assess real-world knowledge.

Dr. Jeff Cass commented that maybe the time had come for supervisors to take more of a role in assessing clinical ability, and to not rely as much on standardized tests.

No more public comment was offered.

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Agenda Item #10: Enforcement Report

Mr. Phillips provided the update on this item, starting on page 36 of the meeting materials.

Dr. Harb Sheets asked for clarification on whether violations reported in the materials refer to the initial allegations, or rather to findings made through the Office of the Attorney General.

Mr. Phillips confirmed that the data in the report reflects cases that have gone through the entire disciplinary process and received this final disposition.

Dr. Rodgers asked for a definition of a ‘tolled probationer’, for the benefit of the audience.

Mr. Phillips explained that this term referred to a probationer who had not resumed practice under the conditions of their probation, and therefore time was not elapsing towards the end of their probationary term.

Mr. Foo asked Mr. Phillips whether it would be possible at the May Board meeting for the Enforcement Committee to address comments received by the Board that were included in today’s materials, regarding the enforcement process. He asked whether this could be presented in flowchart format.

Mr. Phillips replied that this could be done.

Dr. Rodgers called for public comment.

No public comment was offered.

Agenda Item #11: Licensure Committee Report

Dr. Harb Sheets introduced Ms. Xiong to provide an update on this item, starting on page 62 of the meeting materials.

a) Licensing Report

Ms. Cheung commented on factors that contribute to delays in processing applications, especially errors and omissions in the submitted paperwork.

Dr. Harb Sheets commented that there was discussion in the psychological community about the growing restrictions on out-of-state practice. She added that the Board’s regulations were now consistent with those of BBS. She clarified that the intent was not to have people seeing out-of-state clients indefinitely.

Dr. Harb Sheets called for public comment.

419 Dr. Harb Sheets called for Board comment.

421 Dr. Casuga asked about additional accommodations that might be available to test
422 takers, beyond English as a second language.

423

424 Dr. Harb Sheets commented that it was unclear as to whether accommodation requests
425 should be made to the Board or to ASPPB.

426

427 Ms. Hansen confirmed that accommodation requests are sent directly to the Board.

428

429 No further Board comment was offered.

430

431 Dr. Harb Sheets called for public comment.

432

433 No public comment was offered.

434

435 c) Continuing Professional Development and Renewals Report

436

437 Mr. Polk provided the update on this item, starting on page 77 of the meeting materials.

438

439 Dr. Harb Sheets called for Board comment.

440

441 Mr. Foo asked Mr. Polk about whether feedback about the additional CPD categories
442 has been favorable or not.

443

444 Mr. Polk commented that the feedback had been mostly positive.

445

446 Mr. Foo added that he was encouraged to see an increase in the numbers of licensees
447 passing their audits, and attributed this to the flexibility in establishing qualified types of
448 experience.

449

450 No further Board comments were offered.

452 Dr. Harb Sheets called for public comment.

453

454 No public comment was offered.

456 d) EPPP Update

458 Mr. Burke provided the update on this item, starting on page three of the first hand-carry
459 packet.

461 Mr. Burke called for Board comment.

463 Dr. Harb Sheets asked whether the Board's contract with ASPPB would be renewed
464 specifying IEPPP, and also other services, like PsyPact.

466 Mr. Burke confirmed that the contract renewal would be specific to the IEPPP.

481 Dr. Casuga commented that California Psychological Association (CPA) should always
482 be included in the stakeholder meeting discussion, along with the different Association
483 of Regional Center Agencies (ARCA) ARCA groups, and other professional
484 associations.
485
486 Mr. Foo commented that there should be a way to involve consumer advocacy groups
487 that represent, for example, parents and school personnel unions, as well as those
488 representing disability advocates.
489
490 It was (M)Harb Sheets(S)Casuga(C) to direct staff to proceed with the survey at the
491 earliest possible time and to further authorize the Executive Officer to make any non-
492 substantive changes.
493
494 Dr. Harb Sheets called for Board discussion.
495

514 1) SB 903 (Padilla) Mental health professionals: artificial intelligence (AI).

515
516 Dr. Casuga called for Board discussion.

517
518 Mr. Foo asked whether there had been discussions about how long an AI agent would
519 retain recordings of patient interactions in terms of consent and health privacy laws.

520
521 Ms. Mancilla replied that the current bill language does not specify the retention
522 timelines for recordings.

523
524 Mr. Foo asked whether staff had received any complaints regarding the use of AI by a
525 licensee in a way that was inconsistent with best practice.

526
527 Ms. Mancilla replied that legislation passed last year did anticipate the possibility of this
528 being an area of concern but did not have statistics on whether any such complaints
529 had been received.

530
531 Dr. Casuga commented that it was routine practice for providers to want to record
532 sessions, and that clients should provide informed consent before any recording takes
533 place. She added that, since this was already common in the professional community,
534 that it made sense to apply this same transparency with AI tools.

535
536 No further Board comments were offered.

537
538 It was (M)Harb Sheets(S)Rodgers(C) that the Board take a support position on SB 903.

539
540 Dr. Casuga called for Board comment.

541
542 Dr. Cervantes commented that this bill should continue to be reviewed at subsequent
543 Committee meetings.

634 the IEPPP, whether that would complicate the process of getting licensed in California.

635

636 Mr. Burke commented that the IEPPP is still the only examination under discussion at
637 this point in the process, and that it might be a different situation years from now.

638
639 Mr. Foo asked whether any complaints had been received regarding individuals from
640 PsyPact states misrepresenting themselves as having the e-passport.

641
642 Mr. Burke replied that such violations would be under the purview of ASPPB.

643
644 Dr. Casuga asked Mr. Foo to clarify whether he was asking for license verification for
645 the e-passport.

646
647 Mr. Foo replied that he was.

648
649 Mr. Burke commented that Janet Orwig, of PsyPact, would be willing to present at a
650 future Board meeting to address many of these questions.

651
652 Mr. Foo commented that he would like to know whether there are mechanisms in place
653 for ensuring that a licensee who surrendered their license in another jurisdiction for
654 serious violations would not be able to use PsyPact to become licensed in California.

655
656 Dr. Harb Sheets expressed an interest in serving on the Telepsychology Committee if
657 Dr. Tate decided to start it up again.
